Session Description: During the March EPIC Center webinar on Care Coordination and Case Management, Healthy Start grantees understood case management to be the provision of services through a coordinated, culturally competent approach that includes client assessment, referral, monitoring, facilitation, and follow-up on utilization of needed services. For pregnant women, these services include those that assure access and utilization of quality prenatal care, delivery, and postpartum care. For infants up to two years of age, these services assure access and utilization of appropriate quality preventive and primary care services. Using this definition as an operating principle, this session will continue the discussion, exploring with grantees examples from the field of strategies, successes, challenges and key elements.
