There are many biological and sociological gender differences between men and women

but some of the most primary distinctions include **men and mental health**, which includes the prevalence, diagnosis, escalation and treatment of mental illnesses.

The Silent Mental Health Crisis In Men

There's a tragic intersection of low rates of diagnosed depression and high rates of suicide and substance abuse among the U.S. male population.

Men account for 75% of all suicide victims in the U.S., with one man taking his own life every 20 minutes.

Around the world, men are 3 – 7.5Xs more likely than women to take their own lives.
